

This second edition, held in Gijón on October 3 and 4, 2024, focused on the main theme of archaeological cultural heritage, tourism, and territorial development: conflicts, strategies, solutions, and management. It specifically addressed the role of Roman roads as a means of alleviating congestion.

Additionally, the seminar centered on three complementary topics:

- The role of cultural and archaeological heritage as a resource for tourism and development.
- The positive and negative impacts of this phenomenon on the territory.
- The effects on local communities.

With a strong emphasis on roundtable discussions, the 2nd Roman Roads Seminar encouraged exchange and debate on these issues through an international and interdisciplinary panel of speakers. The event featured a total of 18 speakers.






